

# APPLIQUÉ POINTS

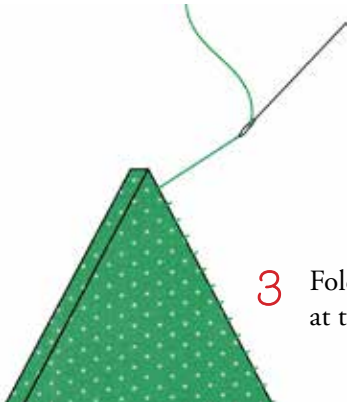
## APPLIQUÉ POINTS USING THE NEEDLE-TURN METHOD



1 Trim the seam allowance as you near the point to approximately  $\frac{1}{8}$ " (don't go smaller than this or your fabric will ravel).



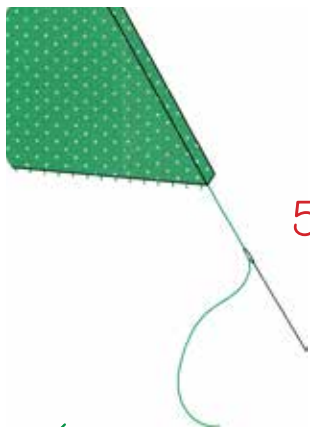
2 Stop sewing **one or two inches** from the point. Trim the excess "dog ear" that is sticking out on the other side of the point (see diagram 1).



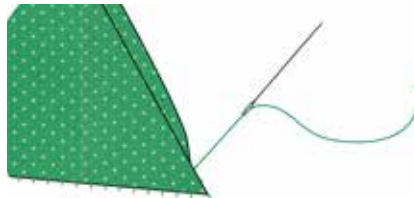
3 Fold or "square up" the fabric at the tip of the point.



4 Continue stitching using slightly smaller appliqué stitches as you near the point and take the last stitch coming right out of the point.



5 Turn your project and starting at the point tuck under the seam allowance. Continue stitching down the other side.



## APPLIQUÉ POINTS USING THE SPRAY STARCH METHOD

When prepping your appliqué, trim the points straight across before you turn under the seam allowance, leaving about  $\frac{1}{8}$ " fabric as shown in the diagram. Prepare and turn under appliqué seam following the spray starch method.

Appliqué and as you near the point and take a stitch coming right out of the end of the point.

Turn your project and starting at the point, tuck under the seam allowance (if it feels too bulky, you can trim some of the excess seam allowance near the point). Continue stitching down the other side.
