Stocking Treats 8" x 11 ½" Stocking

These little stockings have so many uses. Make some for those hard to wrap Christmas gifts like gift cards, treats for a teacher, candies, jewelery etc. Decorate your holiday table by placing one at each place setting to hold silverware. Hang them on your tree to hold gift certificates or cards filled with cash.



Materials Needed for One Stocking:

Cuff: cut one 10½" x 8½" rectangle
Stocking: cut two 14" x 14" squares
Hanger: 6" of ½" ribbon
Freezer Paper & Sharpie™ Ultra Fine Black Permanent Marker

Instructions for making Stocking Treats

All seams are 1/4"

- Using a permanent marker, trace the stocking pattern onto the dull side of freezer paper. Trace directly on the black line. Cut out pattern on traced line.
- Place stocking fabric right sides together. Center freezer paper template shiny side down on wrong side of fabric. Iron to fabric. (Don't remove the freezer paper pattern, you will be stitching around it.)
- Stitch around stocking, right next to freezer paper pattern, leaving top edge of stocking open. Back stitch at beginning and end. *Tip: Use an open toe foot and "needle down" if you have it on your machine.*
- Cut out stocking ¼" from stitched line and across top of stocking pattern. Do not add ¼" to the top of the stocking, cut directly on the traced line. Remove freezer paper. Clip curves.
- Turn stocking right side out. Round curves with a point turner or dull chop stick. Be careful not to poke through fabric. Press.
- Cuff: Fold cuff, right sides together. Using ¼" seam allowance stitch 8½"ends of cuff together, creating a "loop". Back stitch at beginning and end. Press seam open.
- With wrong sides together, fold cuff in half lengthwise, matching raw edges.
- Insert folded cuff into stocking, matching raw edges with top of stocking. Pin right side of cuff to wrong side of stocking, matching seams.
- Stitch cuff to stocking with 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam toward stocking.
- Fold cuff to front of stocking forming a 3½" cuff. Press fold.
- Cut a 6" piece of ribbon. Fold in half and machine stitch to inside of stocking about ½" from top of stocking. Your stocking is finished!
